CHALLENGE

Trans people in India, the USA, and the UK continue to face systemic barriers — from discrimination and cultural stigma to limited access to healthcare, education, and family support. Across regions, bullying, unsafe environments, and poor mental health resources restrict their opportunities and well-being, underscoring the urgent need for visibility, empowerment, and systemic change.

STORY SIGNIFICANCE

Adam Harry always knew he was meant to fly—but never imagined he'd rewrite aviation history. From a small-town dreamer to guiding India's Aviation Authority in creating the nation's first trans pilot policy, Adam's journey transforms personal struggle into systemic change. His story proves that no rule, system, or stigma can ground a dream built on courage and conviction.

IMPACT

CHIRAKU (Wing) is a powerful documentary that uplifts trans visibility and inspires systemic change. Chronicling Adam Harry's barrier-breaking journey across India, South Africa, and Australia, with support from the USA, it celebrates resilience and the power of dreams. Through theatrical and festival premieres, educational screenings, and a global digital release, the film drives conversations on inclusion, equity, and economic empowerment—mobilizing audiences and institutions toward a more inclusive world.

From a young age, I learned that “don’t ask, don’t tell” was the policy for peace at home. That silence informed my storytelling, shaping a film practice that resists erasure with cinematic ambition, tenderness, and unapologetic heart.

As a transmasculine, queer, immigrant filmmaker of color, I’ve lived the contradictions I explore on screen — from gendered airport lines to love that defies borders. I cultivate cross-cultural, cross-identity teams where filmmaking becomes a space of care, learning, and transformation — proving that collaboration itself can be an act of resistance and hope.

Neelu Bhuman is a bold, playful filmmaker whose tender, intersectional lens resists erasure by amplifying joy. His debut feature *TRANSFINITE* (2019) was nominated for Frameline's Outstanding First Feature Award, premiered Opening Night at the San Francisco Transgender Film Festival, won the TranScreen Audience Award, and is distributed via Amazon Prime, OUTtv, and OTV. Supported by Sheffield DocFest, Firelight Media, BFI Doc Society, and the Netflix-backed Film Fund, Neelu has been twice nominated for Sundance's Trans Possibilities Intensive and for IDA's Logan Elevate. His films center on the "preferably unheard," using contradiction, absurdity, and beauty to reveal emotional truth.
